Christiana Care: Transforming Wilmington

For more than a century Wilmington Hospital has served its community, meeting diverse medical needs and providing a critical safety net for the underserved. Now, that facility has outgrown its capacity to serve the community's burgeoning needs. Through an unprecedented \$205 million investment, Christiana Care Health System is expanding and rebuilding this vital lifeline, a transformation to ensure its neighbors have access to the highest levels of care and comfort for decades to come.

The Christiana Care Wilmington Campus

- The campus is Wilmington's 4th largest employer, with 1,900 employees.
- 50,000 people each year visit the Emergency Department, making it the second busiest emergency department in Delaware. More than 7,500 people were admitted to the hospital through the Emergency Department.
- More than 60% of Emergency Department patients live in Wilmington; another 20% of Wilmington Hospital Emergency Department patients live in Claymont and Brandywine Hundred.
- 70,000 people are treated at the Wilmington Hospital Health Center annually.

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The Christiana Care Wilmington Campus: Transformed

Beginning in Spring 2008 and continuing for five years, Christiana Care will invest \$205 million in new construction on the Wilmington Campus in the heart of downtown Wilmington, using environmentally friendly construction techniques, incorporating natural light and providing wireless Internet access throughout the campus. This massive project could create as many as 600 new permanent jobs.

Key features:

- 337,000 square feet will be added, bringing the campus' total medical square-footage to more than one million square feet;
- The size of the Emergency Department will be doubled, with a new and separate entrance on Washington Street;
- More than 62,000 square feet of existing hospital space and 10,000 square feet of medical office space will be renovated;
- A new, nine-story, 286,000 square foot tower will rise;
- 13 new operating-room suites will replace the existing 10 operating rooms;
- 30 additional single-patient rooms will be created;
- An essential new Intensive Care Unit is included;
- Capacity is included for up to 90 additional future patient beds;
- A new 51,000 square-foot, state-of-the-art medical office building will allow more physicians to practice on-site;
- The hospital's front entrance and road leading to the campus on Jefferson Street will be redesigned; and
- An enclosed walkway from the visitor parking garage to the hospital will be added.
